

- Worldwide medical services to the warfighter – Frontline to CONUS fixed medical treatment facilities









Facilitates rapid JTF HQ establishment. Fulfills on-call GRF execution.



- Discharge: 5 seconds/Reload: 12 minutes
- Fire containment does not extinguish, but contains fire
