 - 2 Reserve Support Squadrons (Joint planners)





Hurricane Hunters

- 53rd Weather Reconnaissance Squadron at Keesler AFB, MS
- Performs 100% of DOD Weather Reconnaissance commitment
- WC-130Js are equipped with meteorological data-gathering instruments

Aerial Spray

- Utilizing modified C-130H2 aircraft at Youngstown ARB, OH
- Mission supports Federal Emergency Management Agency
- Responds to public health emergencies and oil spills—Katrina, Deep Water Horizon
- Sprays for mosquitoes, moths, weed control on bombing ranges, throughout the nation.

MAFFS II

- Utilizing modified C-130H3 aircraft at Peterson AFB, CO
- Modular Airborne Firefighting System
- Direct support to U.S. Forest Service
- Carries 3,000 gallons of retardant
- Discharge: 5 seconds/Reload: 12 minutes
- Fire containment does not extinguish, but contains fire

Air Force Reserve Today

- More than **85 percent** of Reservists have served in the **active duty Air Force**
- Average **aircrew member** is currently performing more than **110 days** of Reserve duty each year
- Average **support member** trains over **70-80 days** each year
- About **50 percent** of a typical Reservist's availability is spent on **training**; **50 percent** performed in support of **real world contingency operations**
